Description:

As part of the Consolidated Transit Application to the Iowa DOT a public hearing is required to collect public comment on the application. This notice was published in the Gazette at the end of March and no public comment has been received thus far. A separate agenda item will be to approve an authorizing resolution for the Consolidated Transit Application, which enables ECICOG to submit the entire application.

Financial Impact: None to ECICOG as part of the public hearing.

NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

Notice is hereby given that a public hearing will be held by the East Central Iowa Council of Governments (ECICOG) Board of Directors at 1:30 p.m. Thursday, April 28th, 2022 at the ECICOG office at 700 16th St NE Suite 301 Cedar Rapids. The purpose of this hearing is to solicit citizen input regarding the FY 2023 Consolidated Transit Application. The Region 10 transit planning area includes the counties of Benton, Iowa, Johnson, Jones, Linn, and Washington.

This hearing will discuss an application from the East Central Iowa Council of Governments (ECICOG) to the Iowa Department of Transportation for financial assistance for FY 2023 transit operating and capital needs. ECICOG will request federal and state transit assistance amounting to approximately \$1,034,618 and \$578,768 respectively for the support of day-to-day operations for Corridor Rides Transit, which consists of the following public transit providers: Benton County Transportation, Iowa County Transportation, Johnson County SEATS, Jones County JETS, Linn County LIFTS, Washington County Mini Bus, 380Express and CorridorRides vanpool. ECICOG will also request federal transit assistance to support the following planned capital equipment activities (cost estimates per unit are noted):

- Replace 2 minivans (\$67,360)
- Replace 9 light-duty buses with 138" wheelbase (\$93,340)
- Replace 2 light-duty buses with 158" wheelbase (\$95,700)
- Replace 2 light-duty buses with 176" wheelbase (\$101,760)
- Replace 1 Medium Duty Bus (\$340,450)

The total estimated cost of these capital purchases is \$1,710,150. If approved, federal funds will be matched with local financing on an 85% federal - 15% local basis. These projects will not have significant detrimental environmental effects on the area and no persons or businesses will be displaced by these activities. The transit projects are in conformance with the Region 10 FY 2023-2026 TIP.

Any interested person or agency is invited to attend this hearing and speak for or against these projects. Written comments will be accepted by ECICOG through the date and time of the public hearing specified above. Description:

Each year, ECICOG applies to the Iowa DOT Bureau of Public Transit via the Consolidated Transit Application in order to be recognized as an official public transit agency. The Consolidated Transit Application allows ECICOG to access DOT and Federal Transit operating funding, as well as access to Federal Transit funding to replace buses. In particular the authorizing resolution allows ECICOG Transit Administrator Brock Grenis to be the signatory for various funding applications and agreements with the DOT, as well as a commitment that ECICOG has sufficient local match for transit grant applications submitted throughout the year.

Financial Impact: The capital and operating associated with the consolidated transit application are mostly "pass-through" funds in the ECICOG budget that get distributed to the seven transit contractors who operate public transit services. ECICOG does withhold a portion of the operating assistance for administrative expenses, and any unspent funds at the end of the fiscal year are held in a transit account to be used in future years on transit expenses only.

1. CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order by Chairperson Zirkelbach at 1:30 p.m.

- a. Recognition of Alternates none
- b. Public Comments

Andy Whiting gave an update on potential funding opportunities.

c. Approve Agenda

M/S/C (Fish/Yoder) to approve the agenda as presented. All ayes. Lumsden asked about item 4c. and if ECICOG must follow the open records rule to post any changes to an agenda 24 hours before the meeting. Kurt said the Board can talk about the action item and authorize the executive committee to meet next week.

2. APPROVE MINUTES

a. Board Meeting Minutes of February 24, 2022

Zirkelbach said Mary Audia should have been listed under members absent.

M/S/C (Lumsden/Griggs) to approve the minutes of the February 24, 2022 board meeting with the addition of adding Mary Audia to members absent. All ayes.

3. FINANCIAL REPORT

a. Receive and File Financial Statements for Audit

Kurt said the annual federal transit assistance was received and significantly increased revenue for the month. M/S/C (Griggs/Van Kerckhove) to receive and file the February financial statements for audit.

b. Approve Expenditures

M/S/C (Lumsden/Van Kerckhove) to approve the expenditures. All ayes.

4. ACTION ITEMS

a. Consider Approval of Lease Agreement for Washington County Mini Bus PTIG Project

Grenis said ECICOG was awarded a \$472,456 from the IDOT Public Transit Infrastructure Grant program to remodel and expand the current facility used by Washington County Mini Bus. A stipulation of the grant funds is ECICOG must own the property for thirty years so Mini Bus will transfer ownership to ECICOG for thirty years and ECICOG will transfer the property back to Mini Bus at the end of the lease. This is the same process used for the Jones and Benton County PTIG projects. A copy of the lease was included in the packet. Discussion followed.

M/S/C (Fish/Seeman) to approve the lease agreement for the Washington County PTIG grant project between ECICOG and the City of Washington. All ayes.

b. Approve RLF Funding for Stratafolio, Inc and Authorizing Resolution

Jacobson said the RLF Committee reviewed an application for Stratafolio Inc. and information was included in the packet. The committee's recommendation is \$100,000 (divided into 4 tranches of \$25k each; at least 1 job created before another tranch lent) at 0% interest for 1 year, then 2% for 4 years. A UCC lien, personal guarantees and 2nd mortgages plus assignment of rents for collateral up to the amount of the loan. M/S/C (Van Kerckhove/Griggs) to approve the RLF Committee's recommendation and authorizing resolution to fund Stratafolio Inc. \$100,000 (divided into 4 tranches of \$25k each; at least 1 job created before another tranch lent) at 0% interest for 1 year, then 2% for 4 years. A UCC lien, personal guarantees and 2nd mortgages plus assignment of rents for collateral up to the amount of the loan. All ayes.

c. Approve RLF Funding for Eco Pallets, Inc and Authorizing Resolution

Kurt asked the Board to authorize the Executive Committee to meet next week to review this application. Jacobson gave a quick overview of the project.

M/S/C (Van Kerkhove/Griggs) to authorize the Executive Committee to meet to review the loan application at their earliest opportunity. All ayes.

She said she and Achenbach were in Washington with Mary Audia and Debbie Durham with IEDA to tour 3 businesses. Kurt said she would be out of the office next week and Mary Rump would be the Acting Director.

Kurt gave an update on the Keep Iowa Beautiful Hometown Pride program and said ECICOG would be helping the City of Iowa City with a 5-year strategic plan.

c. Community Development and Housing Report

Achenbach gave an overview of current projects. She said she met with twelve Linn County communities regarding funding for disaster recovery to be available in September or October.

d. Transportation and Transit Report-none

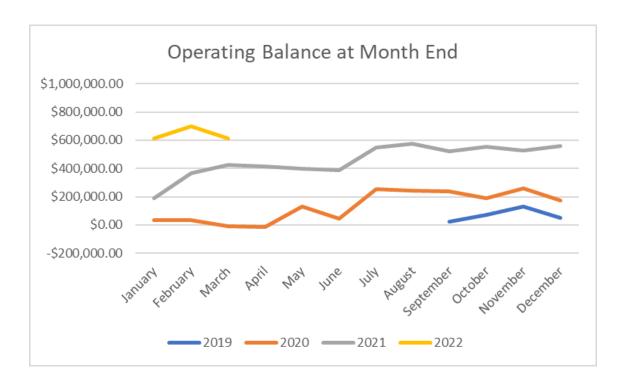

Executive Director's Report – April 2022

<u>Envision East Central Iowa</u> We are working on the next steps in terms of transitioning Envision East Central Iowa from planning to action. Future IQ has been delayed with our report drafts, but we are expecting the Strategy Committee to begin reviewing them the week of April 24 and to share their feedback on May 5.

<u>Destination Iowa Grants</u> Destination Iowa is a \$100 million grant program through IEDA to bolster the quality of life in Iowa's communities and attract visitors and new residents to the state. Cities, counties, nonprofits and other organizations can apply for Destination Iowa grants from four separate funds: Economically Significant Development, Outdoor Recreation, Tourism Attraction and Creative Placemaking. This funding source pairs nicely with Envision East Central Iowa's strategic pillar of "creating more vibrant communities". More information can be found at: https://www.iowaeda.com/

Revolving Loan Fund We have just over two months remaining to loan out the remainder of the 4 million granted through EDA/CARES Act to our revolving loan program in July 2020. If Eco Pallets accepts the terms of the loan made last month, we will have around \$600,000 uncommitted. Loan Specialist Robyn Jacobson is currently working with a few high-potential companies and we remain hopeful that will be able to loan the majority of remaining funds. If we do not, any uncommitted funds will revert back to the federal government. We are still waiting for approval for the defederalization of our original loan fund.

<u>Linn County APRA Applications</u> ECICOG submitted two ARPA applications during the Linn County open process for ARPA funds. The projects involved rural economic development assessments and updating fringe area agreements. Unfortunately, neither application was awarded funds in the highly competitive process. We have reached out to the Linn County Planning Department to gauge their interest in engaging ECICOG to update fringe area agreements for three rural communities whose plans are set to expire.

Housing The Iowa Finance Authority contacted ECICOG to extend an invitation to four communities in our region to submit a proposal for a pilot owner and renter rehabilitation program. This invitation is directly correlated with Community Development and Housing Director Tracey Achenbach's excellent presentation during Debi Durham's visit to Washington. The intention of the program is to build upon the improvements that have been made in their downtown areas by improving the condition of housing in nearby neighborhoods. The cities have been extended an invitation to submit a proposal, and if successful, will be asked to submit a full application. ECICOG is assisting them in the development of their proposals, which are due April 29.

The Marion City Council approved utilizing a portion of their ARPA funds for housing and intends to utilize ECICOG to administer a few of the programs. A portion of the funds will be used to establish an

owner-occupied rehabilitation program in a targeted area of the city and a smaller portion will be dedicated to assisting homeowners with emergency repairs. The City Council also intends to provide additional assistance to residents participating in the Housing Fund for Linn County rehabilitation program.

<u>ECICOG 28E Agreement</u> Board Members Darrin Gage, Derek Lumsden and Kathleen Van Steenhuyse met to review potential changes to ECICOG's 28E Agreement (I previously referred to this updating our "bylaws"). We anticipate providing proposed revisions to the Board in May for adoption in June. In general, the proposed revisions codify or clarify current or best practices versus radically departing from our traditional operating norms.

<u>Website</u> Staff are continuing to work with Vinton-based web design firm Monkeythis on updating our website. We will also be engaging Monkeythis to do some regional photography for our site and other publications.

<u>Upcoming Surgery</u> After returning from my vacation, I had an MRI for my right shoulder which has been "frozen" since late last summer. It turns out that I don't have a frozen shoulder, as originally diagnosed, but rather several tears in my rotator cuff. The tears will require surgery and several weeks in an arm sling. We won't know the exact path to recovery until the surgery is completed, but I am guessing I will need 1-2 weeks of leave, followed by several weeks of restrictions. I am anticipating this surgery will take place this summer.

Staff Updates Economic Development Specialist Adam Bentley will be leaving ECICOG effective June 1. Adam was hired with funds from our EDA CARES Act grant for a two-year period. While we intend to continue the position, Adam has decided to pursue opportunities closer to his home in Grundy County. He may do smaller contracted projects with us in the future. We are working on finalizing a contract with Keep Iowa Beautiful for their Hometown Pride program. Once completed, we hope to move forward with recruitment for Adam's replacement.
